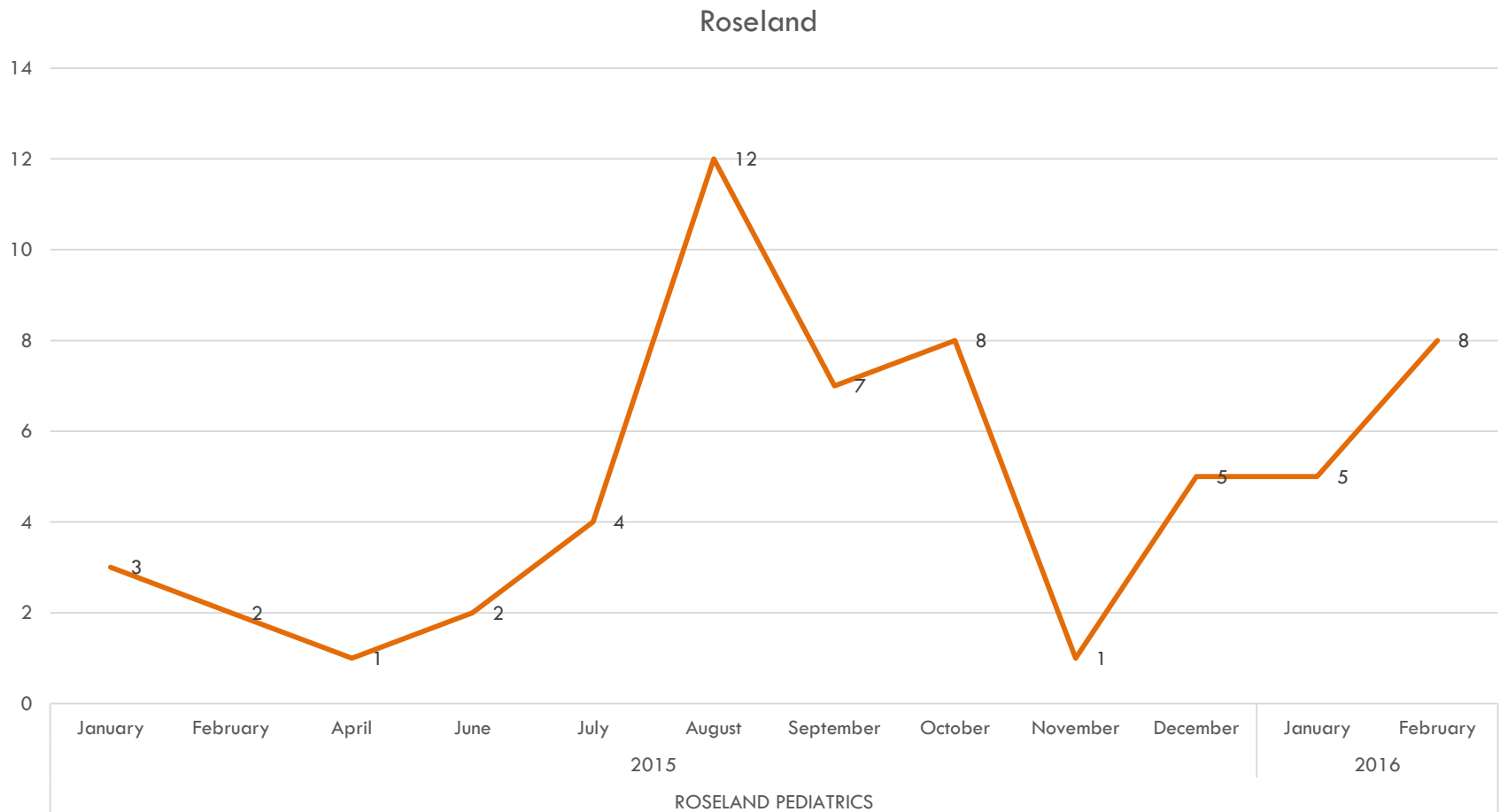

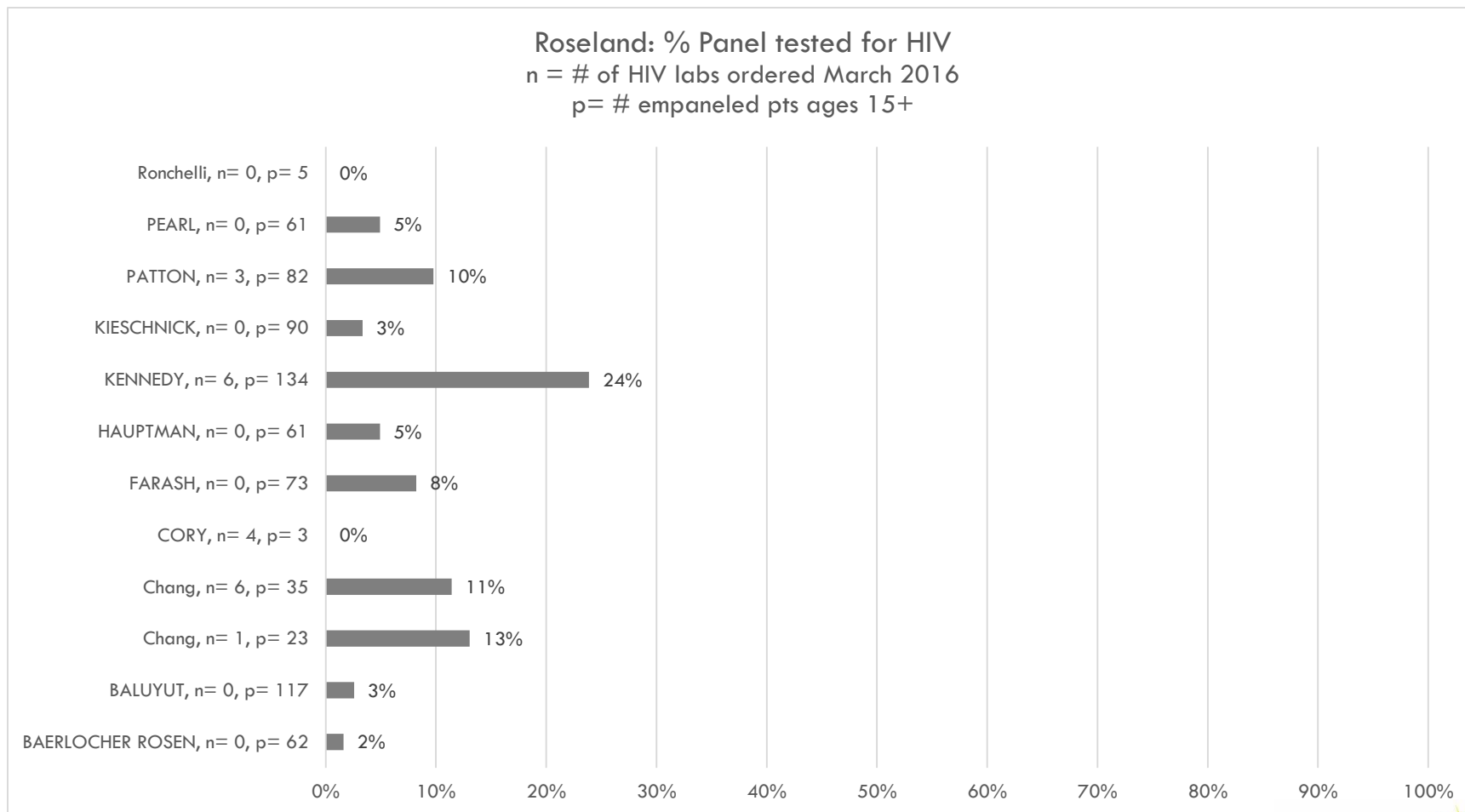

VIDA Care Team Standing Order: Routine HIV Screening

What: Routine HIV Screening Any nurse, medical assistant and/or outreach worker employed or contracted by SRCHC may order an HIV test as outlined below:

Why: See SRCHC HIV Screening Policy and Procedure

Whom:

All patients ages 15-65 without a documented HIV test lab result in the medical record

Any patient who requests an HIV test

Reminder: Any patient with an HIV indicator clinical condition needs diagnostic HIV testing: Examples:

Any new Sexually Transmitted Infection (Syphilis, Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, other) ,
Tuberculosis (Latent or Active)
Viral Hepatitis (C or B),
Cervical or Anal Dysplasia, or
Cancer

How often:

Once in a lifetime HIV testing for all patients age 15-65

At least annual screen for patients with ongoing risk for HIV infections

How:

- Prevention counseling should NOT be required with HIV diagnostic testing
- Instead of required written consent, California law (Health and Safety Code Section 120990(a)) requires medical care providers to do the following before they order an HIV test:
 - Advise the patient that an HIV test is planned;
 - Provide information about the HIV test;
 - Inform the patient that there are numerous treatment options available for a patient who tests positive for HIV and that a person who tests negative for HIV should continue to be routinely tested;
 - Advise the patient that he or she has the right to decline the HIV test;
- If no insurance Vista MA/CTA/VRN enrolls patient in F-PACT or refers to Application assistant.
- Staff assigns diagnosis codes on progress note:
 - ICD9: V25.49 Family PACT patients
 - V73.89 non-Family PACT patients
- After 10/1/15: ICD10: Z11.4 Encounter for screening for human immunodeficiency virus [HIV]
- Staff orders and transmits lab: HIV AB(SCREEN), HIV 1/2, EIA, WITH REFLEXES

This Standing Order will be reviewed annually.

CA Law AB446 states that verbal consent is ok:

“Our clinic routinely screens all patients for HIV.

We will test you this visit for HIV.

**If your test is positive, treatment for HIV is
available. OK?”**
