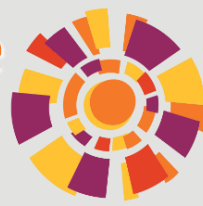

United in heart.

Positive changes in staff and patient knowledge, attitudes and beliefs about HIV and HIV testing

94% Staff who think HIV screening fits into their clinic workflow

Staff who thought HIV screening was a high priority:

Before the project **29%**

Now **69%**

78% Patients who said HIV screening was NOT a hard choice

Staff who are comfortable talking to patients about HIV screening:

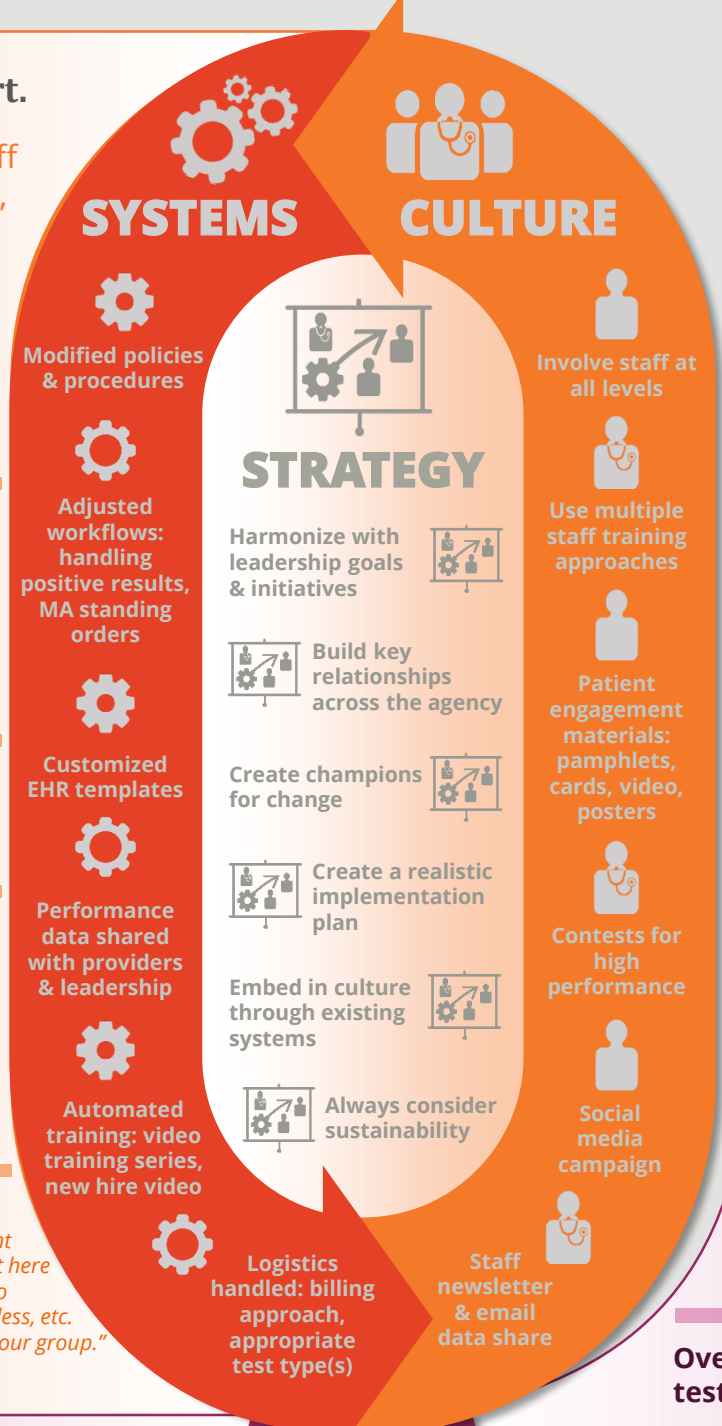
Before the project **52%**

Now **83%**

"The ability to bring HIV testing to the forefront of our clinic staff and patient care is huge. It is especially important here because we treat a lot of patients who engage in IV drug use, who are homeless, etc. so this project is super important for our group."

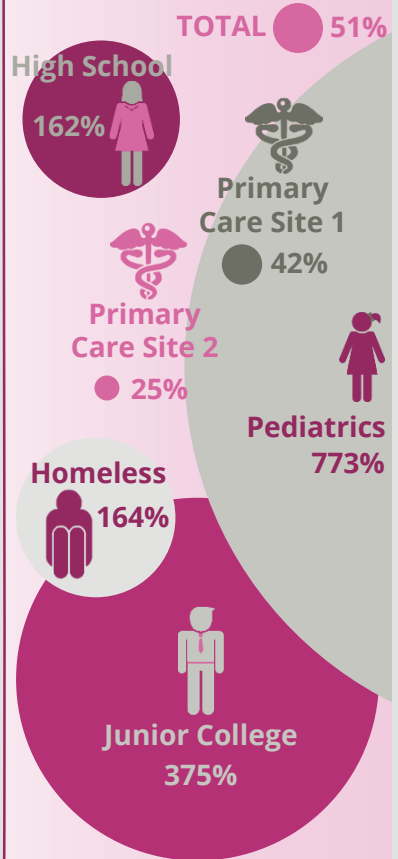

OUR RESULTS

Every site improved, but amounts varied by site & patient population.



Relative percentage improvement in testing numbers between 6 months before project to most recent 6 months. Sites doing little testing at the start showed the greatest relative improvement. For example, the Drug Treatment site (not shown) went from 1 to 31 tests, a 3100% increase.

Overall, we nearly doubled our testing rate.

United in health.

More patients know their status

5 Newly diagnosed positive results from opt-out testing

HIV positive patients linked to care **4 of 5**

United in justice.

Less community-wide risk

HIV+ patients taking anti-viral medication

90% + HIV+ patients with undetectable viral loads

Increased HIV testing

Early diagnosis

Improved health outcomes

Decreased individual & community viral load

Stopping the spread of HIV

We deployed a variety of interventions, some **Systemic**, some **Cultural**.

26% of all active patients 15 & older tested as of June 30 2015

51% tested as of Oct. 31 2015
